Yes, I am concerned related to their proposal to landscape within the trail corridor versus on their property based on the narrow width of our ODT easement at this location. The concerns are related to long-term vegetation management and also potential tree root damage to the trail. In addition, this may be a section of trail that will be targeted for widening in the future. I will try to make a site visit soon to further evaluate.

I also have concerns with the truck crossing of the ODT that is still in the proposal.

I will check to see where we are with our overall Road response next-week.
